Apologies for Absence There were no apologies for absence

Family Matters The Campbells celebrated their anniversary last week. Best wishes were extended to them.

The minutes were read by Danique Hayden.

Mosaic Project

Mrs. Hall advised that Mr. E.G. Hunter of NWA said the cost of correcting the problem caused by the Mosaic project would be approximately \$80million and that he made a proposal for the project to be attached to South Coast Highway project. Mr. Paulwell promised to follow up on that proposal. Carol Jumpp however expressed concerns that the matter will not be dealt with and that more residents will be adversely affected.

Security

Sgt. Campbell was unable to connect to the meeting, but Mrs. Hall asked that persons air their concerns and she would seek to have them addressed on the page.

The followingproblems were reported:

- 1. The police refused to take a report of an intruder as they felt it was not a serious matter.
- 2. When the issue concerns a person of unsound mind, the police say they are not responsible to deal with it.
- 3. Not being able to contact the police as their phone lines are down or they don't have a vehicle to respond.
- 4. While persons voiced the opinion that the police did not respond quickly and sometimes not at all, one resident said they seem to respond to minor issues such as turning off music while not dealing with more serious issues such as burglaries.

The suggestion was made that representatives from the association meet with Sgt. Campbell to have the matters resolved. If there are no improvements then letters should be sent to Sgt. Campbell and his superior at Elliston Road Station. Issues could also be posted on the police Twitter account.

Report from Mr. Clue

Lorna Harris gave the following report on behalf of Mr. Clue

- 2 He has a list of streetlights to be fixed and is working with JPS to have them done.
- 3 Drain cleaning will begin soon.
